AMENDMENT

OFFERED BY MR. SHADEGG OF ARIZONA

Insert the following new Section after Section 137:

SEC. 138. ENSURE TREATMENT OF BREAST CANCER

(a) Findings

- (1) The five-year survival rate for breast cancer is significantly higher in the United States compared to countries with government-run health care systems.
- (2) Based on a 2008 Lancet Oncology study, the five-year breast cancer survival in the United States is 84%, compared to 82% in Canada, 73% in Europe, and 69% in the England.
- (3) Medical innovation and drug development has made the United States the world leader in breast cancer treatment, resulting in dramatically better outcomes for American breast cancer patients.

(b) The Government Accountability Office shall conduct an annual study concerning the treatment of breast cancer in the United States. The study shall focus on the changes in treatment available to breast cancer patients as a result of the creation of a public health insurance option and the use of comparative effectiveness research to make coverage determinations for enrollees of the public plan.

(c) The Secretary shall certify, beginning in Y1 and annually thereafter, whether the public health insurance option has had a deleterious effect on the 5-year survival rate for breast cancer. The Secretary shall terminate the operation of the public health insurance option as of such date that the Secretary certifies that the public health insurance option has had a harmful effect on the five-year survival rate for breast cancer.
